# The CJI Oxford Debate

- Participants argue either for or against a motion
- They have not been allowed to choose whether they are arguing for or against

*This means they are often forced to argue a position which they personally disagree with*

*So the arguments put forward are not necessarily the views of the people saying them – but it allows us to see arguments for both sides*

- The audience decides who argued best – not which proposition they personally believe in

**Remember: Just because they are saying something during the debate it does not mean they necessarily believe it.**
